Did you know?

What can you do if your ball lands where it interferes with a movable or immovable obstruction?

Movable Items

1. Loose impediments are unattached natural objects (stones, leaves, twigs, pinecones, insects, worms or other animals, etc.), that are not attached, growing, solidly embedded in the ground or sticking to the ball. They can be moved out of the way but if the ball moves there is a one stroke penalty and you must move your ball back to where it was. There is no penalty stroke if you are on the green. Sand and loose soil are not loose impediments and may be moved only on the green. Snow and natural ice (not frost) are loose impediments and can be considered temporary water. Dew and frost are just that and are not loose impediments. A loose impediment may not be moved to affect a ball in motion. A player can move loose impediments in any way, including by hand, with a towel, a hat, a club or could even be blown away if possible. The player still needs to be careful not to improve the area around the ball or move the ball.

2. Movable Obstructions are artificial items that may be moved anywhere on or off the course, regardless of where the ball lies. However, they may not be moved to deliberately affect a ball in motion. Items such as red or entry stakes, rakes, towels, cans and trash may be moved without unreasonable effort or damage to the course or object. White stakes or other boundary markers and tee markers (on the hole you are playing) may not be moved. If the ball is accidentally moved in the process of moving a movable obstruction, there is no penalty and the ball must be replaced. If the ball comes to rest on top of a movable obstruction such as a towel, you may lift the ball, move the obstruction and drop the ball within one club-length of the spot directly under where it lay on the object (if it was on the putting green, place the ball directly on the spot). The ball must be dropped in the same area of the course as the spot directly under where the ball lays on the object.

Immoveable Items: Immoveable obstructions are artificial items such as cart paths, buildings or maintenance boxes. You may use the nearest point of complete relief rule with no penalty to move your ball.

2/4/2026	Switch	Two player teams. Switch ball after tee off and play each ball till holed out
2/11/2026	Dianne Knight Classic	Step aside scramble
2/21-22/2026	Cup Challenge	Which team will you be on???
2/18/2026	Pink Ball	Every team receives a pink ball. Player score alternates on each hole
2/25/2026	5 of Clubs	Player chooses 5 clubs including putter to play entire round
3/4/2026	Low Gross/Low Net	Practice round for Member/Guest
3/7-8/2026	Member/Guest	
3/11/2026	Bingo, Bango, Bongo	1 pt each for first to green, closest to pin and first to hole
