Did you know?

Improving your lie or position by moving growing things

Your ball comes to rest under a tree, and it appears you have a shot. Only problem is a pesky limb interfering with your backswing. No worries: you can break that branch off, yes?

No: you can move naturally growing objects only if they are loose impediments—that is, unattached and not growing. You cannot move, bend, or break objects that are still growing or attached, as that would be improving the conditions affecting your stroke.

A loose impediment is a natural object that is not: attached or growing, solidly embedded in the ground not sticking to your ball. If you accidentally cause your ball to move while removing a loose impediment, you must replace the ball. A one-stroke penalty applies everywhere on the course except on the putting green.

Exceptions:

- **Taking a stance:** You are allowed to move a growing object if you do so fairly while taking your stance. The movement should be minimal and represent the least intrusive stance possible.
- **Making a stroke:** During your backswing or downswing, you can move, bend, or break growing objects, provided you complete the stroke.
- **The teeing area:** The rules are much more liberal in the teeing area. Before you play your first stroke of a hole, you can move, bend, or break growing objects to improve your lie.

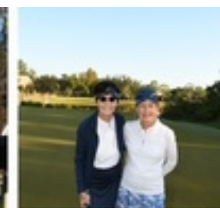
